Humility, Know your role.

Be humbled and grateful to be at any place at the table. Proverbs is one of those books in the Bible that gives us practical wisdom. Written by Solomon, this scripture tells us to come into a space with respect and don't be entitled and manage our expectations on where we should sit at someone else's table. Authentic Unconditional Welcome, Strangers to the Table.

In Jesus' parable in Luke, he said that we are to invite who are in need instead of just people that are our friends or that are rich. Home Away from Home is a program for military members that are able to go home for Thanksgiving at Keesler AFB in Biloxi, MS. This program places about 800-1000 Airmen at the Thanksgiving tables of strangers in the community. Many Airmen do not have the money or enough time off built up to go home for Thanksgiving. This program is a living example of authentic unconditional welcome.
